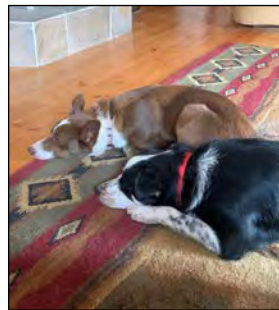
The Prez Sez

Drill Team Fun Day

Seven riders showed up at Nancy and David's home October 8 for a fun change up from trail riding. The horses happily settled into a relaxing day of formation riding at the walk, and the riders with some expert schooling from Nancy, actually learned the patterns too. The drilling wrapped up by noon to avoid the afternoon heat, followed by lunch before heading home. It was a real confidence builder to drill with other riders and horses.

The art of riding in formation comes from military and ceremonial histories of many different nations. Today it is a great way to improve your riding skills and train your horse. Riders learn speed control, proper spacing and geometric precision. Drills consist of interconnected movements such as Carousel, Partners, Abreast, Thread the Needle and Arrow. The day starts with riders practicing each movement before riding through the whole drill. In the beginning riders and horses are often unsure and tentative but soon gain confidence and precision.
