Hello All,

In our January newsletter, there was an article that I found very interesting about

horse whorls. I had always heard about horse whorls but had never read anything or known much about it. I immediately made predictions about my horses and ran out into the pasture to see if I was correct. All of my horses had whorls that matched their personality and the experiences that I have had with them. Easygoing Sarge's whirl is dead center, Gypsy's whorl is high and to the right, she can be anxious. Lance's horse Freya, a confident mare, has a whorl that is dead center too. The most interesting observation was my mare Ruby. Generally, Ruby is a loving animal. Whenever I would have a bad day, Lance would tell me to go out and see Dr. Ruby. Oftentimes if I couldn't sleep I would go out to the pasture in the middle of the night and Ruby would somehow quietly sneak up on me and breathe deeply into my hair. Then she would wrap her neck around me and pull me in. It was like she knew when I needed a hug.

But.... that is not all there is to Ruby. She has another side, a diva side. Ruby is the lead mare around my house and keeps everyone in line. She rules with an Iron Hoof. Lance and I used to call her RubyHyde when she would be in this mood.

On the other hand, I would take her to the same pasture with the usual flakes of hay set out on the ground. Some days she would walk up and calmly eat, and other days she would run circles around the hay like it was a monster of GREAT proportions.

Strange Horse Laws

Here is a collection of some of the wildest horse laws ever passed. Hope you enjoy! No one knows how they got there and no one living has a memory of anyone arrested under them.

- In Hartsville, Illinois, you can be arrested for riding an ugly horse.
- It's illegal to fish from horseback in Washington DC, Utah and Colorado while lassoing a fish in Tennessee is definitely out.
- A misworded ordinance in Wolf Point, Montana: "No horse shall be allowed in public without its owner wearing a halter."
- A Fort Collins, Colorado Municipal Code: "It is unlawful for any male rider, within the limits of this community, to wink at any female rider with whom he is acquainted."
- A 1907 Cumberland County, Tennessee statute reads: "Speed while on horseback upon county roads will be limited to three miles an hour unless the rider sees a bailiff who does not appear to have had a drink in thirty days, then the horseman will be permitted to make what he can."
- Male horse buffs in Basalt, Nevada, are prohibited from eating onions between the hours of 7 a.m. and 7 p.m. while out riding.
- Law specifies only men! Ice cream lovers beware in Cotton Valley, Louisiana. Citizens aren't allowed to eat an ice cream cone while on horseback in public places.



- It is strictly against the law in Bicknell, Indiana, for a man to leave his new bride alone and go riding with his pals on his wedding day. The penalty is a week in jail.
- Budds Creek, Maryland, has an antique law which prohibits horses from sleeping in a bathtub, unless the rider is also sleeping with the horse.
- In New York, donkeys are not allowed to sleep in bathtubs.
- Paradise, California, retains a most unusual law that says it is illegal to let a horse sleep in a bakery within the limits of the community. What about goats, cows, etc.?? Only horses are mentioned.
- An attorney can be barred from practicing law in Corvallis, Oregon, should he refuse to accept a horse in lieu of his legal fees.
- It is against the law in California for horses to mate in public within five hundred yards of any church, school or tavern! The penalty can be a \$500 fine and six months in jail. This law isn't clear as to whether the horse or the owner is fined and jailed.
- In case you have an accident in Hortonville, New York, here's their antique law: "The rider of any horse involved in an accident resulting in death shall immediately dismount and give his name and address to the person killed.
- Watch out in Rhinelander, Wisconsin if you are riding a horse while intoxicated! An old ordinance takes care of the problem. Such a horseman, per the law, must be given a "large dose of castor oil." Who doles out the penalty? The horseman's wife! Refusal to take the castor oil results in a fine!
- It is legal to take your horse into a tavern in Burns, Oregon, just as long as you've paid for its admission.

In closing, a summation of Clergyman Henry Ward Beecher's view on the art of lawmaking: "We bury men when they are dead, but we try to embalm the dead body of laws, keeping the corpse in sight long after the vitality has gone. It usually takes a hundred years to make a law; and then, after the law has done its work, it usually takes another hundred years to get rid of it."
